Dear Campaigner,

As you may know, there were a series of meetings at the beginning of the year between the F.R.A. the F.R.C. and what was then the N.C.R.M. and now is the Campaign for Independent Broadcasting.

Although it was not obvious at the time, a merger between the F.R.A. and the F.R.C. was imminent. That has now taken place and Alex Ickenna is now the Press Officer for the F.R.A.

However, there are some members of the F.R.C. who are not very happy with this idea, and because they are not able to continue entirely on their own, they have decided to continue working in their local area under the name of F.R.C. or some such similar, but on matters of national interest, for example, a rally, they will support the main group whose policy they agree with. For example, I agree more with the C.I.B. than I do with the F.R.A., and therefore, will tend to support them.

F.R.M. will be discontinued; but there may be the possibility of a rather more comprehensive paper appearing in due time, if the need arises.

I, personally will be delighted to hear from any Campaigner and would be pleased to supply any further information, leaflets and publicity material.
